

Sugar Maple

- o U Lobes
- No Milk when stem is cut
- o Can be used for furniture and firewood
- o 2nd most common maple
- o Maple Syrup
 - Most of sap is water



Sweet Gum

- o One ingredient for Citronella
- Sap is sugary and elastic
- O Sap is like chewing gum
 - What Indians used





- o Black stuff will stain clothes
 - Woodstains have walnuts in them
- o Expensive lumber
- o Compound pinnate leaf



White Oak

- o Rough, flakey bark
- o Get really big



Red Oak

- o Symmetrical Leaves
- o Rough and smooth spots like a ski slope







Poplar (Tulip Tree)

- Softer hard wood
- Tend to be brittle in wind storms
 - Don't want poplars near home
- o Get a tulip-like flower
- Used for furniture



Sycamore

- o Love water, wetlands
- o Hard to cut
- o Not a lot of uses but seeds for birds
- Peeling bark



Flowering Dogwood

- o Has a bud that looks like a queen's crown
- o Coronus Florida
- Get a white flower
- o Do not grow very big





• Day Lily

- o Tolerate almost any soil
- o Full sun



Holly

- o Male and female plants
- o Females have berries



Magnolia

- o Cucumber and Sweetbay Magnolias
- Oval Leaves
- Often flowers get a long fuzzy bud



Juniper

- o Very strong pungent smell
- There are juniper trees and shrubs



• White Pine

- o Needles come in bundles of 5
- o Long needles
- o White sap on the pine cones when it dries
- o Sap will stain
- o Tree used for wood finishing
- o Awesome for molding
- o Soft
- o Usually one of the larger evergreens
- o Gets a lot of knots
- o Value to ecosystem because of seeds in pine cones





95% of mushrooms in Pa are poisonous

A lot of non-brightly colored are poisonous as well

Ragweed

- Wildflower comes out in August/September
- Leaves like a marigold
- Gets tons of pollen sacks
- o Pollen very bad for allergies
- o Big and spikey pollen grains





Fruit trees have long skinny leaves, which generally have teeth

Hawthorn

- o Thorns like a splinter
- o Native Americans used them to sew... Like a needle





• Hickory

- o Compound pinnate leaf
- Shagbark hickory easy to tell
 - Long Peeling Strips
- o Shellbark
- o Pig Nut (smallest)
